## THE PRELIMINARY MARLBORO PIKE SECTOR PLAN AND PROPOSED SECTIONAL MAP AMENDMENT

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 28 of the Annotated Code of Maryland and the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, the Prince George's County Council, sitting as the District Council, and the Prince George's County Planning Board of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, joint public hearing to receive testimony regarding the preliminary plan and rezoning of some properties generally located within a portion of Planning Areas 75A and 75B in accordance with the recommendations of the *Preliminary Marlboro Pike Sector Plan and Proposed Sectional Map Amendment*. The sector plan area primarily focuses on the Marlboro Pike corridor bound by the District of Columbia to the west, the Capital Beltway (I-95/495) to the east, and Pennsylvania Avenue to the south. The northern boundary of the sector plan traverses side streets and property lines that are roughly one quarter mile from Marlboro Pike.
