RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

The Naming of Lake Artemesia Park

FOR the purpose of recommending the designation of a new park and recreation facility as Lake Artemesia Park.

WHEREAS, the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority is constructing a park, lake and recreation area near the confluence of Paint Branch Creek and Indian Creek in conjunction with the construction of the College Park Metro Station; and

WHEREAS, there formerly existed a lake at the site named Lake Artemesia; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Berwyn Heights and the City of College Park, within whose municipal boundaries the completed lake and recreation area will lie, have expressed the desire that the new facility be named "Lake Artemesia Park" in recognition of the historical name associated with the area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission is hereby requested to designate the lake and recreation area located in the Town of Berwyn Heights and the City of College Park near the confluence of Paint Branch Creek and Indian Creek as the "Lake Artemesia Park".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk shall forward a copy of this resolution to the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, the Town of Berwyn Heights and the City of College Park.
