	RESOLUTION
A RESOLUTION concerning	
Prince George's Correctional Facilities Safety Task Force	
For the purpose of establishing a task force to gather information, evaluate, and make	
recommendations for improving safety, especially for inmates and employees, within the adult	
detention center of the Prince George's County Department of Corrections, also known as the	
Prince George's County Jail.	
WHEREAS the purpose of the Prince George's County Jail is to improve public safety	
through fostering accountability and rehabilitation for its inmate population; and	
WHEREAS the employees, inmates, and visitors of the Prince George's County Jail should	
be subjected to a safe environment within the jail; and	
WHEREAS there is an ongoing concern about the levels of inmate-to-inmate violence,	

violence on Department of Corrections staff, and safety in general at the Prince George's County Jail; and

WHEREAS the areas of inmate interaction should be monitored to the maximum extent practicable to ensure safety within the Prince George's County Jail; and

WHEREAS other correctional facilities in the state reportedly have more effective and thorough coverage practices for monitoring inmate interaction and behavior at their facilities that could be emulated and incorporated to improve safety at the Prince George's County Jail; and

WHEREAS Prince George's County has a vital interest in fostering an environment within the Prince George's County Jail that reduces recidivism, protects the safety of employees and inmates, and overall improves safety.

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Council hereby establishes the Prince George's Correctional Facilities Safety Task Force, for the purpose of and in exercise of the following:
- (a) Reviewing and analyzing data and other information regarding incidents at the Prince George's County Jail, particularly those that relate to violence or harm to employees, inmates, and visitors at the jail;
- (b) Conducting surveys and interviews with current and former employees, inmates, and visitors to Prince George's County Jail concerning jail safety, including anonymous or confidential surveys and interviews to preserve the safety of respondents;
- (c) Observing and evaluating the safety features and monitoring coverage of the facilities at the Prince George's County Jail, including relying on the expertise of those who specialize in jail and correctional facility safety; and
- (d) Observing, comparing, and considering the safety practices and features of other peer correctional facilities to determine whether there are elements that can be incorporated into the safety practices at the Prince George's County Jail to improve the safety of employees, inmates, and visitors at the jail, especially any best practices; and
 - (e) Obtaining public input about safety at the Prince George's County Jail; and
- (f) Making comprehensive recommendations for improving safety at the Prince George's County Jail.
- (g) The membership of the Prince George's Correctional Facilities Safety Task Force shall be as follows:
- (1) One person to serve as Chair of the task force, appointed by the Chair of the County Council, and a non-employee of the County;
- (2) One person to serve as Vice-Chair of the task force, appointed by the County Executive, and a non-employee of the County;
- (3) Two members who are returning citizens appointed by the Chair of the County Council;
- (4) One member from the Prince George's County Returning Citizens Affairs Division, appointed by the County Executive;
- (5) Two members of organizations that work with pre- and post-release of formerly incarcerated populations in Prince George's County, one appointed by the Chair of the County

1 Council and one appointed by the County Executive; 2 (6) Four members who are recommended by the Prince George's County Correctional 3 Officers' Association and appointed by the Chair of the County Council; and (7) One member of the County Council appointed by the Chair of the County Council 4 5 to serve as an ex-officio or non-voting member. 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's Correctional Facilities Safety Task 7 Force shall have the full cooperation of every county agency to the extent allowable by law, as 8 enforced by the County Auditor; 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's Correctional Facilities Safety Task 10 Force shall be appointed no later than 90 days after the adoption of this resolution, meet in 11 accordance with a schedule determined by the Chair of the Prince George's Correctional 12 Facilities Safety Task Force, and publicly issue its final written report no later than one year after the adoption of this resolution, subject to a 180 day extension of the final report deadline as 13 14 determined by a majority vote of the Prince George's Correctional Facilities Safety Task Force at 15 a public meeting. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's Correctional Facilities Safety Task 16 17 Force shall cease to exist 60 days after issuance of its final written report and this resolution shall 18 be of no further force or effect on such date.
