Evaluation of the Regulations to Analyze the Development Impact on Public School Facilities For the purpose of examining the current statistical datum and methodology, including a comparative analysis of both the merits and deficiencies of the current system versus the proposed recommendations presented by the Planning Staff to the Council on January 25, 2001, or measuring and projecting pupil populations at public school facilities to evaluate the effectiveness of existing practices and to obtain recommendations to improve the accuracy and timeliness of future projections.

WHEREAS, the County Council approved and adopted Regulations to Analyze the Development Impact on Public School Facilities with the adoption of CR-4-1998; and

WHEREAS, certain Appendices to the adopted Regulations pertaining to Funded School Construction Projects, 5-year Enrollment Projections, and Actual Enrollment require amendment each year by the Planing Board staff on or before January 1 of each year to permit the application of adequacy tests for public school facilities; and

WHEREAS, the preparation of enrollment statistics and the enrollment projections have been plagued by inaccuracies, inconsistencies and tardiness; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Prince George's County maintains a number of educational programs and maintains a number of pupil assignment and school boundary policies that can be established, altered, waived, or terminated at will that significantly impact the assignment of public school children to individual schools; and

WHEREAS, assumptions contained within the various methods of measuring and projecting pupil populations used by both the Planning Board and the Board of Education have

resulted in inconsistent pupil population projections and delay in the preparation of current appendices for the administration of adequacy tests; and

WHEREAS, the Council and the public have lost confidence in the existing system for counting and projecting pupil populations in a manner that provides an objective basis for approving the construction of new residential development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Prince George's County Planning Board is directed to commission an independent, outside audit of the existing system of collecting pupil population data and projecting pupil population and recommend to the County Council corrective amendments to the existing Regulations to Analyze the Development Impact on Public School Facilities no later than June 1, 2001. Extensions may be approved by the County Council if deemed appropriate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Board's recommendations shall address the following issues:

- 1. A comparative analysis of both the merits and deficiencies of the current system versus the proposed recommendations presented by the Planning Staff to the Council on January 25, 2001.
 - 2. The role of the Board of Education pertaining to data collection and data reporting;
 - 3. The appropriateness of the September 30 pupil census to measure student population;
 - 4. The appropriateness of the January 1 deadline for annual adjustment of statistics;
- 5. The appropriateness of adjustments to the September 30 pupil census by the Board of Education;
- 6. Whether the measurement and projection of high school or middle school pupil populations have continued utility in the testing of adequate public school facilities;
- 7. Whether reliable statistical methods exist to account for the Board of Education's pupil assignment policies, both pupil-based and school-based, to evaluate the future impact of proposed residential development on public school facilities;
- 8. Whether proven and demonstrable alternative techniques used in other Maryland counties to construct and manage public school facilities to accommodate new residential development would be appropriate for use in Prince George's County, including an analysis of the merits and deficiencies of the pay-and-go policies in those jurisdictions currently having or previously having pay-and-go in place.
