SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County					
Maryland, that Sec	tions 14-140 and 14-141 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same				
are hereby repealed	and reenacted with the following amendments:				
	SUBTITLE 14. MORALS AND CONDUCT.				
	DIVISION 6. WEAPONS.				
Sec. 14-140. Load	led weapons prohibited; exceptions.				
(a) <u>Prohibited.</u> No person shall discharge or have in [his] <u>their</u> possession, while loaded,					
any firearm, rifle, shotgun, revolver, pistol, air gun, air rifle, or any similar mechanism known					
whatever name [kn	ow], which is designed to expel a projectile through a gun barrel by the action				

of any explosive, gas, compressed air, spring or elastic, within one thousand feet (1,000') of any

home or residence, other than [his] <u>their</u> own, or any school or school grounds (private or public), church or church grounds, places of public assembly, public parks and playgrounds within the County, whether the weapon is loaded with blank or live cartridges or projectiles of any kind.

(b) Exceptions. This Section shall not prohibit the owner or tenant of any land from discharging such described weapons on [his] their land for the purpose of the protection of [his] their own property or the life of [himself] themself or [his] their family, or killing predatory animals which prey upon, damage or destroy [his] their property, livestock or crops.

Sec. 14-141. - Transfer of weapon to minor prohibited; penalty. [exceptions.]

- (a) No person shall give, sell, rent, lend or otherwise transfer any gun or weapon described in Section 14-140 or additive manufacturing technology, designed to use, create, or manufacture an untraceable firearm, explosive ammunition or any projectile therefor, within the County to a minor under the age of seventeen (17) years, except where the relationship of parent and child, guardian and ward or adult instructor and pupil exists between such person and the minor.
- (b) "Additive manufacturing" in Subsection (a) refers to a computer-controlled process that creates three dimensional objects from a digital file by depositing materials one layer at a time, also known as 3-D printing.
- (c) "Untraceable firearm" in Subsection (a), commonly referred to as a "ghost gun", has the meaning stated in Section 5-701(h) of the Public Safety Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- (d) [This Section shall not apply to any regulated firearms regulated by Sections 441 to 448, Article 27, Annotated Code of Maryland, 1957.] Any person convicted of a violation of this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by the maximum fine permitted under State law; or by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months; or both.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such

invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, 1 2 or section. SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) 3 4 calendar days after it becomes law.
