Sec. 5-172. Legislati	ive Intent.	
(a) The purpose ar	nd intent of this legislation is to decrease the crime of prostitution by	
enhancing lodging estab	lishment rental practices. This legislation will establish reasonable and	
uniform laws to promote	the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens and residents of the	
County, which are in res	ponse to the occurrence of prostitution in the County.	
Sec. 5-173. Definition	ns.	

1	(a) The following words, as used in this Division, shall for the purpose of this Division,	
2	have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this Section:	
3	(1) Lodging Establishment shall mean an inn, hotel, motel, rooming house, tourist	
4	home, tourist cabin park, or other establishment that has at least four rooms	
5	available for a fee to transient guests for lodging or sleeping purposes.	
6	(2) Innkeeper shall mean the owner, operator, manager, or keeper of a lodging	
7	establishment, or the agent of an owner, operator, manager, or keeper of a lodging	
8	<u>establishment.</u>	
9	Sec. 5-174. Room rental.	
10	(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 5-168, 5-169, 5-170, 5-171 of this Code,	
11	lodging establishments shall be subject to the following:	
12	(1) There shall be standard posted check-in and check-out times and rooms can only be	
13	rented by the day, and not by the hour; and	
14	(2) The same room cannot be rented more than one time per day.	
15	Sec. 5-175. Registration.	
16	(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 5-168, 5-169, 5-170, 5-171 of this Code,	
17	lodging establishments shall be subject to the following:	
18	(b) An innkeeper shall require each guest or guests responsible for the room to register and	
19	shall require the guest or guests responsible for the room to produce:	
20	(1) a valid driver's license;	
21	(2) a valid military identification card;	
22	(3) a valid passport; or	
23	(4) any valid government issued identification card.	
24	(c) A copy of the identification required pursuant to this Section shall be kept on file for	
25	forty-eight hours.	
26	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby	
27	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph	
28	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of	
29	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining	
30	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this	
31	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
