	RESOLUTION		
A RESOLUTIO	N concerning Flash Flooding in Prince George's County		
For the purpose of stating the intention of the Prince George's County Council to provide			
	ood damage not covered by homeowners' insurance for damage caused by flash		
	ng throughout the County.		
WHEREAS, Prince George's County experienced record-setting rainfalls in June and July			
2006, producing as much as six inches of rain in some areas of the County; and			
WHEREAS, the record rainfalls also produced flash flooding events generating as much as			
eight feet of water that flooded homes in the Town of Edmonston, the City of Hyattsville, the			
community of Lewisdale, the community of Fort Washington and the City of Laurel, as well as			
other parts of Prince George's County; and			
WHEREAS, flash floods can roll boulders, destroy trees, damage homes, bridges, buildings			
and float cars; and			
	S, six inches of flood water from a flash flood can knock a person off their feet,		
and annually results in the most weather-related deaths in the United States; and			
_	S, hundreds of Prince George's homes were damaged by recent flash floods in		
the Town of Edmonston, the City of Hyattsville, the community of Lewisdale, the community of			
	and the City of Laurel in Prince George's County; and		
WHEREAS, no disaster or emergency relief has been declared by FEMA or the State of			
Maryland for the flood damage sustained by these dwellings;			
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's			
County, Maryland, that flood damage in the Town of Edmonston, the City of Hyattsville, the			

community of Lewisdale, the community of Fort Washington and the City of Laurel is severe

enough to be declared flood disaster areas by Prince George's County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, pursuant to Sections 6-134 and 6-137 of the Prince George's County Code, the County Executive is requested to request that the Governor declare these affected areas by the flood as an Emergency Management or Disaster Area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Emergency Management is directed to survey the areas impacted by the flash flooding to document the level of damage to support a request for declaration of emergency by the Governor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Prince George's County Council declares its intent to approve funding for homeowners who are the victims of the June 2006 flash flooding in the Town of Edmonston, the City of Hyattsville, the community of Lewisdale, the community of Fort Washington and the City of Laurel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Council requests the Prince George's County Executive to transmit emergency supplemental appropriation for the repair of flood-damaged homes in the Town of Edmonston, the City of Hyattsville, the community of Lewisdale, the community of Fort Washington and the City of Laurel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Council proposes that the County Executive and County Council form a joint Task Force to develop criteria for evaluating those homes damaged by the flash flooding, determining the cost of the damage less any insurance payments as the ceiling for any reimbursements for the flash flood damage to homes in Prince George's County.
