RESOLUTION

1 A RESOLUTION concerning

2 Juneteenth National Holiday Campaign and Observance

3 For the purpose of expressing support for the Juneteenth National Holiday Campaign and
4 Observance.

5 WHEREAS, approximately eleven and a half million African-Americans survived the
6 “Middle Passage,” a month-long voyage across the Atlantic Ocean stacked in the bottom of slave
7 ships and were subjected to more than 200 years of slavery upon arrival in the United States; and

8 WHEREAS, more than two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation was
9 signed by President Abraham Lincoln on September 22, 1863, on June 19, 1865, Major General
10 Gordon Granger issued General Order Number 3, declaring that, in accordance with the
11 Emancipation Proclamation, all slaves were free with an “absolute equality of rights and rights of
12 property between former masters and slaves”; and

13 WHEREAS, Juneteenth, or June 19, is celebrated each year as the date when the last slaves
14 in the United States were freed and commemorates the spontaneous celebration that erupted
15 among African-Americans upon learning of their freedom; and

16 WHEREAS, after more than 130 years of its annual celebration, Juneteenth has been
17 officially recognized by the President and the Congress of the United States as Juneteenth
18 Independence Day; and

19 WHEREAS, Americans of all colors, creeds, cultures, religions and countries of origin
20 share a common love of and respect for freedom, as well as a determination to protect their right
21 to freedom through democratic institutions, by which the tenets of freedom are guaranteed and
22 protected. The nineteenth of June, or “Juneteenth Independence Day,” coupled with

1 Independence Day on the fourth of July, completes the “cycle of freedom” for America’s
2 Independence Day observances.

3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's
4 County, Maryland, that Prince George’s County hereby expresses support for the National
5 Juneteenth Holiday Campaign and encourages participation of employees, families and
6 communities in the Annual WASHINGTON JUNETEENTH National Holiday Observance, on
7 the National Mall, Lincoln Memorial and US Capital Grounds, during the week of the “19th of
8 **June**” in Washington, DC.
