**REPORT:** Favorable 4-0: Council Members Burroughs Franklin, Ivey, and Streeter. Recused: Turner.

The Prince George's County Council's Government and Operations Committee convened on October 13, 2022, to consider two appointments to the Board of Ethics for Prince George's County. The Board renders advisory opinions to officials and the employees of the County as to all questions arising under the Code of Ethics. The Board hears and deliberates on complaints presented by OEA and authorizes the conduct of investigations in connection with the Code of Ethics.

Ms. Turkessa L. Brown, a resident of Bowie, is an Associate with Crowell & Morning, LLP, where she represents clients in litigation, regulatory, and enforcement action initiated by various government agencies, including, but not limited to, the Department of Justice (DOJ), Federal Trade Commission (FTC), and the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). She is adept at conducting annual investigations on behalf of clients to ensure internal compliance with various company policies. Ms. Brown earned an undergraduate degree from Mississippi State University, a Juris Doctor from Howard University School of Law, and a Diversity & Inclusion Certificate from Cornell University.

Ms. Mickei M. Milton, a resident of Upper Marlboro, is a practicing attorney with litigation and corporate counsel experience. She previously served as a Small Claims Arbitrator– Night Court for the New York State Unified Court System. She brings skills to help organizations mitigate risk, maintain compliance and make better decisions with legal analysis. Ms. Milton earned an undergraduate degree from Florida A & M University, a Juris Doctor from Florida Coastal School of Law, and an Executive Master of Business Administration degree from Columbia University Business School.

Questions were raised to the nominees about the Board of Ethics and their roles as members of the Board of Ethics.

After discussion, the Government Operations and Fiscal Policy Committee reported the nominees
