**BILL**

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Non-Commercial Trailer Parking Restrictions

3 For the purpose of establishing parking restrictions for non-commercial trailers; and setting  
4 penalties for violating these parking restrictions.

5 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

6 SUBTITLE 26. VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC.

7 Section 26-123,

8 The Prince George's County Code

9 (2023 Edition; 2024 Supplement).

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,  
11 Maryland, that Section 26-123 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby  
12 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

13 **SUBTITLE 26. VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC.**

14 **DIVISION 8. PARKING REGULATIONS.**

15 **Sec. 26-123. Parking of commercial buses, commercial and other trailers, and commercial**  
16 **trucks restricted; impounding; penalty.**

17 (a) No person shall park any commercial bus, commercial trailer, trailer, or heavy  
18 commercial truck on any street or highway in the County between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and  
19 6:00 a.m., outside the corporate limits of any municipality.

1 (d) Any owner issued a citation for a violation of this Section shall be subject to a fine of  
2 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the first violation, Seven Hundred Fifty (\$750) for the  
3 second violation and One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for the third and for any subsequent  
4 violations; except that those trailers that are not Commercial Trailers shall be subject to a fine of  
5 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each violation and eligible for a separate citation for each  
6 twenty-four (24) hour period such trailer is in violation of this Section.

7 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby  
8 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,  
9 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of  
10 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining  
11 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this  
12 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such  
13 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,  
14 or section.

15 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)  
16 calendar days after it becomes law.
