**BILL**

AN ACT concerning

Chesapeake Bay Critical Area

FOR the purpose of making certain clarifying amendments and adding a definition to the Anti-Litter and Weed ordinance.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

SUBTITLE 14. MORALS AND CONDUCT.

Section 14-118,  
The Prince George's County Code  
(1991 Edition).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 14-118 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

**SUBTITLE 14. MORALS AND CONDUCT.**

**DIVISION 3. ANTI-LITTER AND WEED ORDINANCE.**

**Sec. 14-118. Definitions.**

(i) **Weeds.** The word **weeds** shall mean grass, weeds, brush, and any noxious growth excluding trees, ornamental shrubbery, plants, flowers, garden vegetables properly tended, cultivated crops, vegetation growing in wetlands, or undisturbed woodland including associated underbrush, not otherwise in violation.

(j) Underbrush. The word underbrush shall mean shrubs, bushes, and small trees growing beneath larger trees in a woodland or forest.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect forty five (45) calendar days after the date of its adoption, or when approved by the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area

Commission, whichever later occurs.
