Prince George's County Overview

- According to the U.S. Census Bureau, in 2014 the population of Prince George's County was 904,430
- The pediatric population was 205, 305 or 22.7% of the overall population
- The pediatric population is expected to grow 2.1% by 2020.
- About 39% of the pediatric population is either covered by Medicaid or is uninsured
- CNHS has significant investments in the County, including 2 regional outpatient centers, primary care practices, and mobile health units.

Children's Wages are Competitive


- The median salary of a Children's Employee who lives on Prince George's County: \$51,143.21

Snapshot of Children's Locations, Patients and Services in Prince George's County




