SUBDIVISION BILL

AN ACT concerning

Private Roads and Easements

For the purpose of providing that private roads may be used to serve certain types of dwellings in the M-X-C Zone.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

SUBTITLE 24. SUBDIVISIONS.

Sections 24-128(b)(7)(A),

The Prince George's County Code

(1995 Edition, 1996 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,

Maryland, that Section 24-128(b)(7)(A) of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 24. SUBDIVISIONS.

DIVISION 4. REQUIREMENTS: TRANSPORTATION AND CIRCULATION.

Sec. 24-128. Private roads and easements.

(b) The Planning Board may approve plats and plans of development containing private roads, rights-of-way, and/or easements under the following conditions:

(7) In Comprehensive Design and Mixed Use Zones:

(A) For land in the V-L, V-M, R-L, R-S, R-M, R-U, L-A-C, M-A-C, M-X-C,

and M-X-T Zones, the Planning Board may approve a subdivision (and all attendant plans of

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development) with private roads to serve attached single-family dwellings, two-family dwellings, and three-family dwellings, but not single-family detached or multifamily dwellings, in accordance with the requirements of Subsections (e) and (f) of Section 27-433 of the Zoning Ordinance, except as hereinafter provided. In the V-L, V-M, and R-L Zones, the Planning Board may approve a subdivision with alleys to serve any permitted use, provided the lot has frontage on and pedestrian access to a public right-of-way. For the purposes of this Section, an "alley" shall mean a road providing vehicular access to the rear or side of abutting lots, and which is not intended for general traffic circulation.

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SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect thirty (30) calendar days from the date it becomes law.
