REPORT: COMMITTEE VOTE: Favorable 3-0 (Councilmember's: Campos, Davis, and Lehman)

This bill will amend the County Code by changing all reference to the Office of Information Technology and Communication to the Office of Information Technology. The name change by deleting "Communications" will more accurately reflect the function of the Office.

The Office of Law has reviewed this bill and finds it to be in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its enactment.

The enactment of CB-71-2012 will have a minimal adverse fiscal impact on the County related to the cost of new office supplies to reflect the name change.
