RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Supporting dedicated funding for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) and increasing the Federal Government contribution thereto.

For the purpose of urging The United States Senate to act on the National Capital Transportation Amendments Act of 2005 and for the State of Maryland to address transit funding needs.

WHEREAS, WMATA transports 1.2 million people a day by rail and bus throughout the Washington region. During peak travel periods, 42% of all trips to the region's core are made on transit. Metro service reduces congestion on the region's highways, saves drivers approximately 35 hours in travel time annually, and avoids using 75 million gallons of gas a year; and

WHEREAS, WMATA's Metrorail and Metrobus service provide a critical role in Prince George's County's transportation network. Prince George's County has the highest number of rail stations and most Metrobus service of any suburban jurisdiction in the region, yet significant needs for service remain unmet in the community; and

WHEREAS, Metro plays a key role in Prince George's County's economic development and land-use strategies. The county is promoting quality Transit Oriented Development - vibrant, mixed-use developments within walking distance of the county's 15 Metro stations – to reduce sprawl and auto-dependency and capitalize on economic opportunities; and

WHEREAS, WMATA faces significant funding challenges. A Brookings Institution report, Washington Metro: deficits by Design, found that WMATA's unprecedented lack of dedicated funding sources necessitated an over-reliance on annual appropriations from state and local governments, making WMATA vulnerable to recurring and chronic financial crises.

WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Council of Governments, the Greater Washington Board of Trade and the Federal City Council formed the Panel on Metro Funding. The Panel was tasked to research funding options for WMATA, which it reported in January 0f 2005 to elected officials of Maryland, Virginia and the District of Columbia; and

WHEREAS, the Panel identified a \$2.4 billion shortfall between 2007 and 2015, excluding cost increases for Metroaccess. The panel also recommended that the Compact jurisdictions mutually create a dedicated revenue source for WMATA; and

WHEREAS, the Panel recommended that the federal government significantly participate in addressing the shortfalls, given its reliance on the Metro system. There are 35 Metrorail Stations that directly serve federal facilities and nearly half of Metro's peak period riders are federal employees. Metro also plays a significant role in all federal homeland security planning for the Washington region; and

WHEREAS, to meet WMATA's needs, Congressman Tom Davis of Virginia introduced H.R. 3496, the "National Capital Transportation Amendments Act of 2005," co-sponsored by Congressmen Hoyer, Van Hollen and Wynn. This bill would authorize up to \$1.5 billion for the capital needs of the WMATA system over 10 years, if the WMATA Compact members establish dedicated funding for WMATA. The House of Representatives passed this bill, which is now pending before the Senate Homeland Security & Government Affairs Subcommittee; and

WHEREAS, the Maryland legislature passed in April of 2006 Senate Bill 850 – Mass Transit Funding Study– requiring the Maryland Department of Transportation to study transit funding needs statewide and identify strategies to meet the requirements of the Davis bill. The report is due December 15, 2006.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the County Council urges the United States Senate to pass H.R. 3496, to provide additional federal funding to WMATA as a match to locally generated dedicated funds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council expresses its support of Maryland's Transit Funding Study to identify transit funding needs and urges the Governor and Maryland General Assembly to work with Congress to obtain additional federal funding and ensure stable and reliable funding, for WMATA.
