Dear Chair Oriadha:

Enclosed for the County Council's consideration is the proposed Fiscal Year 2027 through Fiscal Year 2029 Local Impact Grant (LIG) Funds Multi Year Spending Plan in the amount of \$12,174,300 annually.

Pursuant to Section 10-309.02(a) of the Prince George's County Code, and prior to submitting the Multi Year Spending Plan to the Local Development Council, the County Executive shall transmit the Multi Year Plan to the County Council for review and comment. In accordance with County law, the County Council has 30 days to review, comment, and make recommendations.

This proposed spending plan reflects the County's continued commitment to investing Local Impact Grant funds in a manner consistent with State Government Article, Section 9-1A-31, which provides that such funds shall be used for improvements in communities in immediate proximity to video lottery facilities, including investments in public safety, economic and community development, education, workforce development, senior services, and other essential public services.

The enclosed FY 2027 through FY 2029 Spending Plan allocates **\$12,174,300 annually** to programs and initiatives that strengthen communities and improve quality of life throughout Prince George's County, including:

- **\$10,929,300** for education, employment, workforce development, apprenticeship training, and tuition assistance through:
 - Employ Prince George's District 8 Youth Jobs and Apprenticeship Program;
 - Prince George's Community College Foundation for free tuition courses, certifications, workforce development, and apprenticeship training; and
 - Bowie State University for free tuition courses, certifications, workforce development, and apprenticeship training.
- **\$1,120,000** in Community Impact Grants supporting:
 - statutorily required investments in communities within 2.5 miles of the video lottery facility, including the Town of Forest Heights and the Forest Heights Police Activities League;
 - Local Development Council initiatives;
 - food security, community support, and healthy eating initiatives through The Store House; and

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- foreclosure prevention, mediation, housing advocacy, and legal assistance through Strategic Housing Solutions.
- **\$125,000** for County Council administration to support nonprofit oversight, auditing, and accountability for Local Impact Grant-funded programs

This spending plan builds upon prior Local Impact Grant investments by continuing to prioritize educational opportunity, workforce readiness, housing stability, food security, behavioral health, senior services, and community-based partnerships that produce measurable outcomes for Prince George's County residents. The proposed investments also ensure compliance with statutory funding requirements while providing long term, sustainable support for programs that directly benefit communities impacted by gaming activity.

As with prior Local Impact Grant spending plans, this proposal reflects a people centered approach to public investment that prioritizes opportunity, public safety, economic mobility, and neighborhood revitalization while maintaining responsible stewardship of public resources.

The County Council's favorable consideration of the proposed Fiscal Year 2027 through Fiscal Year 2029 Local Impact Grant Multi Year Spending Plan is respectfully requested.
