(a) County Council Minutes - APPROVED

(b) <u>First Reading of Bills (Presentation)</u>

CB-63-2003 – AN ACT CONCERNING PROPERTY TAX CREDIT – SURVIVING SPOUSE OF A FALLEN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER for the purpose of providing for a tax credit for a dwelling owned by the surviving spouse of a fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker. - PRESENTED

#### 4. PUBLIC HEARINGS/BILLS ELIGIBLE FOR THIRD READING (ENACTMENT)

<u>CB-44-2003 (DR-2) (SUBDIVISION BILL) – AN ACT CONCERNING PRIVATE</u>
<u>ROADS AND EASEMENTS</u> for the purpose of permitting the Planning Board to approve private rights-of-way or easements in the C-S-C, M-A-C, M-X-C, and M-X-T Zones under certain circumstances. - *PUBLIC HEARING HELD; ENACTED* 

(Introduced by Council Members Peters, Dean and Harrington on 7/29/2003; favorably reported out of PZED on 7/23/2003 with amendments)

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on Council Bill 44, Draft 2. Mr. William Shipp spoke in support of the legislation. All persons wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Dean moved enactment of Council Bill 44, Draft 2; seconded by Council Member Harrington. The motion carried 8-0 (Absent: Council Member Dernoga).

#### 5. INTRODUCTION AND ADOPTION OF RESOLUTIONS

<u>CR-57-2003 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE</u>
<u>TASK FORCE (SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT)</u> for the purpose of extending and expanding the mission of the Environmental Justice Task Force to advise the County on proposed amendments to the Subdivision Ordinance, the Zoning Ordinance, and the Ten Year Solid Waste Management Plan to mitigate the negative impacts of solid waste facilities on low income and minority communities. - <u>INTRODUCED</u>; <u>RULES SUSPENDED</u>; <u>ADOPTED</u>

Council Resolution 57, which extends and expands the mission of the Environmental Justice Task Force to advise the County on proposed amendments to the Subdivision and Zoning Ordinances and Ten Year Solid Waste Management Plan as related to the locations of and operational criteria for solid waste facilities in Prince George's County, was introduced by Council Members Dean, Shapiro, Knotts, Harrington and Peters. Council Member Harrington moved to suspend the Council Rules of Procedure to allow for the immediate adoption of Council Resolution 57; seconded by Council Member Dean. The motion carried by voice vote (Absent: Council Member Dernoga). Council Member Hendershot moved adoption of Council Resolution 57; seconded by Council Member Dean. The motion carried 8-0 (Absent: Council Member Dernoga).

#### 6. **RESOLUTIONS ELIGIBLE FOR FINAL READING (ADOPTION)**

<u>CR-45-2003 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING HEALTH CARE INSURANCE</u> for the purpose of endorsing a comprehensive health care system for all Marylanders. - <u>ADOPTED</u>

(Introduced by Council Members Shapiro, Dean, Exum, Knotts, Harrington and Peters on 7/22/2003;)

Council Member Hendershot, as Chairman of the Health, Education and Human Services Committee, provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations of the Committee and provided clarifying comments regarding the relationship of this measure to legislation previously before the Maryland General Assembly. Council Resolution 45 was favorably reported out of HEHS on 7/24/2003. Council Member Hendershot moved adoption of Council Resolution 45; seconded by Council Member Harrington. The motion carried 9-0.

#### <u>BRIEFING – (COUNCIL HEARING ROOM) -- BRIEFING HELD</u>

Dr. Frederick Corder, Acting Health Officer for Prince George's County

Dr. James A. Dula, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Health and Human Services, introduced Dr. Frederick Corder to the Council. Dr. Corder provided an overview of his credentials, experience and long-standing relationship with the Health Department as a practicing Pediatrician in Prince George's County. He went on to discuss his goals and vision for the Health Department and responded to Council Member questions (See Administrative Day File dated September 16, 2003 for details).
