LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

COMMITTEE-OF-THE-WHOLE REPORT Date: October 16, 1990

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0-0 (In favor: Council Members Castaldi,

Casula, MacKinnon, Pemberton and Wilson)

The Committee considered a proposed Draft 2 which would add a provision at the beginning of subsection 2-111.1(b) to require the County Executive to present an inventory of County-owned property to the Council by the beginning of May each year for adoption by legislative act. Only those properties which are on the adopted inventory may be proposed for lease, sale or disposal. The proposed Draft 2 also incorporated the provisions of CB-96-1990 into subsection (c), thereby eliminating the need to enact CB-96-1990.

Stan Fetter spoke in favor of Draft 2 and additional provisions

contained in CB-21-1990.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

Requiring that declarations of surplus property and approval of the disposition of such property must be approved by legislative act, requiring that an inventory of County property be approved by legislative act and requiring that any waiver and abatement, adjustment or deferral of County fees, charges or taxes be included in the act approving a disposition. By repealing and reenacting with amendments Prince George's County Code, Section 2-111.1.
