#### RESOLUTION

#### A RESOLUTION concerning

The FY 1996-2000 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development and Combined Federal Grants Applicant

For the purpose of approving and adopting the FY 1996-2000 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development, and combined Federal grants application for Prince George's County's FY 1995-1996 entitlements of Community Development Block Grant, HOME Investment Partnerships, and Emergency Shelter Grant funds.

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, Prince George's County has been qualified as an urban county eligible to receive a twenty--first year entitlement of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds in the amount of \$7,274,000; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, Prince George's County is qualified to receive a fourth entitlement of HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) funds in the amount of \$2,165,000; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act of 1988, Prince George's County is qualified to receive an eighth entitlement of Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) Program funds in the amount of \$247,000; and

WHEREAS, as a condition to the award of the above--referenced funds, regulations of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), effective January 5, 1995, require Prince George's County to prepare and transmit to HUD its Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development including its combined application for the

entitlements under the three grant programs; and

WHEREAS, a Consolidated Plan was prepared following a detailed citizen participation plan, which identifies and assesses housing and community development needs, incorporates a housing market analysis, presents a strategic plan for addressing priority needs, and a one-year action plan describing the use of federal and other resources expected to be available to address priority needs in terms of the objectives set forth in the Consolidated Plan; and

WHEREAS, as a federal requirement for the use of CDBG funds, project funding requests were solicited from the public with those selected for assistance determined to be eligible for support and consistent with the County's priority needs and Action Plan recommendations; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of Subtitle 15A, Prince George's County Code, the County Executive transmitted to the County Council a recommended Consolidated Plan for FY 1996-2000 incorporating the three grant applications, and the Council duly advertised and conducted a public hearing on the proposed Consolidated Plan; and

WHEREAS, the County Council, in recognition of public testimony and on the basis of its review and analysis of the consolidated Plan, finds that said Consolidated Plan generally conforms to the provisions and intent of Subtitle 15A, and accordingly desires to endorse said Consolidated Plan, and thereby authorizes Prince George's County to enter into a grant agreement with HUD to execute said Consolidated Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the proposed "Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development: FY 1996-2000," a copy of which shall be marked for identification by the Clerk of the County Council and maintained as a permanent record, is hereby approved in accordance with the budget summaries labeled "Attachments; A, B, and C" as attached hereto and made a part hereof, and in accordance with such further amendments and conditions hereinafter set forth.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive will reprint the approved Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development: FY 1996- 2000, incorporating all revisions and changes in accordance with the budget summaries hereinafter set forth, and

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shall file a reprinted copy with the County Council at the same time the Consolidated Plan is

transmitted to HUD for approval.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County's Deputy Chief Administrative Officer is

hereby authorized and empowered as the official representative of Prince George's County to

submit the approved Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development: FY 1996-

2000 to HUD, along with all assurances contained therein, to act as necessary in connection

with the submission, and to provide such additional information to HUD as may be required.
