PUBLIC SAFETY AND FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 10/1/98

Committee Vote: Favorable as amended, 4-0, (In favor: Council Members Estepp, Bailey, Scott and Wilson).

This bill will establish procedures for granting franchises for the use of public property and public rights-of-way for telecommunications systems; maintaining the County's rights in and control over public property and public rights-of-way used to provide telecommunications services; providing for payment of rights-of-way charges and other valuable considerations by telecommunications franchises and providing for the franchising of telecommunications systems in the County.

The bill contains numerous amendments recommended by the sponsor after a lengthy discussion on the legislation.

The Office of Management and Budget states that the fees and charges will generate some revenue. The vast majority of the revenue will come from the 5% right-of-way charge on existing long distance telecommunications operations. Based on an estimate of \$2 billion of eligible gross revenues in Maryland provided by the consulting firm of Miller and Van Eaton, these estimated charges will generate approximately \$15 million a year for Prince George's County. This estimate is based on limited data and is subject to a large margin of error. All other fees and charges will generate approximately \$130,000 to \$230,000 per fiscal year through FY2002.
