WHEREAS, th	ne National Organization of Black County Officials, Inc. (NOBCO) and the		
Environmental Prote	ection Agency (EPA) have entered into a cooperative agreement to provide		
information regarding	ng Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) to communities throughout the nation; and		
WHEREAS, po	oor indoor air quality can contribute to short and long term health issues,		
including asthma, re	spiratory tract infection and promote the spread of airborne infectious		
disease and can be p	particularly harmful to members of the community with asthma and/or		
allergies; and			
WHEREAS, no	egative health problems caused or made worse by poor indoor air quality		
have direct economi	c impacts including increased costs for employers, days lost at work for		
employees, and incr	eased health care costs for all members of the community; and		
WHEREAS, th	ne National Organization of Black County Officials is hosting a conference		
focused on the them	e "The Economics of Creating Healthy and Wealthy Diverse Communities"		
at the Marriott Hotel	l in Greenbelt, Maryland from April 19 th –23 rd , 2006; and		
WHEREAS, th	ne Prince George's County Council is the Legislative Branch of Prince		
George's County Go	overnment and sits as the Board of Health to govern and guide County health		
policy; and			

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council is concerned about the health and well-

being of employees, citizens, residents and visitors to the County, and is striving to ensure that all individuals can have a healthy indoor environment; and

WHEREAS, in November, 2005 the Prince George's County Council enacted CB-68-2005 which prohibits smoking in certain eating and drinking establishments and is intended to safeguard employees and patrons from the effects of secondhand smoke.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the National Organization of Black County Officials is hereby commended for its efforts to educate employers, employees, businesses, schools, childcare providers, and the general public about asthma, secondhand smoke and their role in associated illnesses, disabilities and increased health costs as a result of poor indoor air quality.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Prince George's County Council, sitting as the Board of Health, in collaboration with the National Organization of Black County Officials, Inc. (NOBCO), hereby proclaims the 19th day of April, 2006 as "Indoor Air Quality Day".
