The County Council previously established the Tricentennial Celebration Committee by the adoption of CR-92-1988.

Thomas S. Gwynn, Jr. was a former teacher of history and local historian, a former assistant superintendent of schools for building and planning and at the time of his death, the Chairman of the Prince George's Community College Board of Trustees. Mr. Gwynn envisioned the development of a facility in conjunction with the Community College and the County Library System for the preservation of historical and genealogical information pertaining to the County since its founding nearly 300 years ago and the preservation of current artifacts and information for future generations.

The resolution would honor Mr. Gwynn's life and work by encouraging the development of the Prince George's County Museum of History at a portion of a site owned by the Prince George's Community College in Clinton on Piscataway Road.
