PUBLIC SAFETY AND FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT 10/1/98

Committee Vote: Favorable, 3-0, (In favor: Council Members Estepp, Scott and Wilson).

This bill will decrease the Homestead Property Tax credit from 3% to 2% for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999. The Office of Management and Budget has determined that the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the most recent twelve months, rounded to the nearest whole number is 2%. This change is required by the County Charter when the inflation rate changes.

Section 817B of the Charter, which set the tax credit percentage at a maximum of 105%, was approved by the voters in 1994.

The County Executive stated that this legislation will have the effect of placing more stringent limits on the growth in real property assessments for County homeowners.

The reduction in the property tax credit will have a negative fiscal impact on the County estimated at \$800,000 in FY2000.
