Yes, Accela was selected as the vendor to automate the alcoholic beverage licensing and inspection process.

19. According to the FY 2026 responses the BOLC has an average time of 65 days from initial notice to adjudication. Has this time frame changed? Are there plans to reduce this time frame?

The time frame has not changed and there are no plans to reduce this time frame.

The Board anticipates continuing virtual hearings in FY 2027 and can provide hybrid options as necessary.

Target underage alcohol consumption by using a summer youth and a 1,000-hour employee to reduce sales to minors and enhance licensee education through outreach on the BOLC’s Rules and Regulations.

23. What workload challenges does the Board foresee for FY 2027?

The primary challenge is training and onboarding approximately 640 establishments onto the new Accela software for license applications and renewals.

24. Does the Board continue to operate its “Focus Inspection” initiative?

Yes, the BOLC will continue to conduct 'Focus Inspections' on an as-needed basis. These inspections address correction orders and do not result in fines, providing licensees an opportunity to resolve minor discrepancies.

25. Does the Board plan to make any organizational changes or modifications in FY 2026 or in FY 2027? If so, please identify the specific planned changes; the goals, objectives, and rationale for the planned changes; an assessment of the impact that the planned changes are anticipated to have on the Board’s operations; and the short-term and long-term fiscal implications for the Board and the County.

With the purchase of the new Accela software, a full-time systems analyst is needed to support implementation, customization, and ongoing maintenance; ensure integration with agency operations; provide staff training; and troubleshoot issues to maintain efficient and reliable performance. In addition, this position will serve as the agency’s IT Coordinator and liaison to the Office of Information Technology (OIT), providing technical expertise the agency currently lacks.

26. What is the current number of liquor-licensed premises the County is authorized to approve?

The County is authorized to issue up to 701 licenses, with five (5) license classes not subject to statutory limits.
