SECTION 1. BE	IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,						
Maryland, that Section	10A-172.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is						
hereby added:

Sec. 10A-172.01. Returning Citizen Work Requirement in Specified Public Procurements.							
(a) Purpose. The p	urpose of this Section is to:						
(1) promote the employment of returning citizens who have been incarcerated for or

1	convicted of a criminal offense and face obstacles in reentering the workforce; and
2	(2) promote the effective re-entry of citizens transitioning from incarceration or
3	conviction back into society in a manner that fosters positive rehabilitation and reduces the
4	likelihood of reoffending, thereby improving public safety.
5	(b) Definitions. In this Section, the following words have the following meanings:
6	(1) Returning citizen means a citizen of the United States who has previously been
7	confined for any period of time in a facility or environment that is intended to restrict a person's
8	movement and freedom, including but not limited to: a federal, state, or local correctional
9	facility; home detention; or electronic monitoring, as a form of punishment as a result of a
10	criminal conviction.
11	(c) Requirement.
12	(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Subtitle, for any new construction or
13	public works, roadway maintenance, or property maintenance contract or procurement
14	authorized by this Subtitle or otherwise administered by any County agency or quasi-County
15	agency, at least five percent (5%) of the work hours worked in performing such contract or
16	procurement shall be worked by one or more returning citizens.
17	(2) For existing contracts or procurements, this requirement shall be imposed at the time
18	of any renewal or extension of such contracts or procurements.
19	(d) Implementation. In fulfilling the requirement of Subsection (c), above, qualified
20	individuals referred in writing by Employ Prince George's (and/or any other entity designated by
21	the County Executive) to the entity awarded the contract or procurement shall receive first
22	preference by the entity and its subcontractors, if any, in working the hours required to comply
23	with the requirement.
24	(e) Waiver. On a procurement-by-procurement (or contract-by-contract) basis, the Director
25	of the Office of Procurement may waive and either remove or reduce the requirement of
26	Subsection (c), above, if the Director of the Office of Procurement determines in writing that:
27	(1) the requirement would violate federal or state law;
28	(2) the requirement would create an unreasonable liability risk to the County; or
29	(3) there is an insufficient number of qualified returning citizens available to fulfill the
30	requirement.
31	(f) Enforcement. Compliance with this Section shall be a written condition of any contract or

procurement subject to this Section, or the contract or procurement shall be void. (g) Reporting. Any entity awarded a procurement or contract subject to the requirements of this Section shall report in writing in a manner and frequency determined by the Director of the Office of Procurement on the progress of compliance with the requirement of Subsection (c), above, during the performance of such contract or procurement. (h) Regulations authorized. The Director of the Office of Procurement may promulgate regulations to govern the implementation of this Section, provided that such regulations are consistent with the provisions of this Section. SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.
