

Educational Facilities Master Plan (EFMP)

Educational Facilities Master Plan (EFMP) Strategic Plan

- Ramp up to full or limited modernization of older schools across the County based on the MPSP recommended schedule for Cycle 1 (27 schools).
- Address over-utilization by building new schools and adding to existing schools during modernization (prioritize middle schools).
- Address underutilization through planning studies to consider options for more efficient operations – this is essential to obtain state funding for modernization in areas with underutilized schools.
- Present a balanced CIP to include a full range of project types.



The Comprehensive Maintenance Plan Strategy

- Support the teaching and learning environment
- Insure healthy and safe schools
- Protect the District's assets by addressing millions of dollars in deferred maintenance and mandates
- Consolidate repairs/ replacements to 'Make a Difference' (ex: Central HS)
- Shift to more comprehensive renovation projects and <u>preventive</u> maintenance

Garage complete (\$1.5 M). Depot building with facilities for staff in Phase II (+\$700K).



Bus Lot Improvements Needed



\$12 million over 6 years = 5 bus lots

All 12 bus lots need permanent facilities and major site improvements


