**BILL**

AN ACT concerning

Storage Requirements

FOR the purpose of amending the elevation requirement for the storage of certain materials.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

SUBTITLE 12. HEALTH.

Section 12-161(b)

The Prince George's County Code  
(1987 Edition, 1989 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 12-161(b) of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

**SUBTITLE 12. HEALTH.**

**DIVISION 5. PEST CONTROL.**

**Subdivision 3. Rodent-proofing Regulations.**

**Sec. 12-161. Accumulation of garbage, litter, or refuse.**

(b) No person shall permit any premises, improved or unimproved, and all open lots and alleys within the County to accumulate lumber, boxes, barrels, bricks or stones, and similar materials that may be permitted to remain thereon, unless the same shall be placed on open racks that are elevated not less than eighteen (18) inches above the ground or not less than six (6) inches above a weed-free surface on property improved by a one or two family dwelling, and evenly piled so that these materials will not afford a shelter or harborage for rodents.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
