Committee Vote: Favorable, 3-0 (In Favor: Council Members Olson, Harrison, and Dernoga)

The Committee convened on June 12, 2025, to discuss CR-68-2025, which approves up to twenty-five (25) locations for stop sign monitoring systems in the Town of University Park:

Sheridan St & Baltimore Ave EB Underwood St & 44th Ave NWB 40th Ave & Queens Chapel Rd WB 40th & Calverton NWB Clagett & Clagett-Pineway Underwood & Queens Chapel Pineway & Clagett-Pineway, SB Clagett & Clagett-Pineway SB College Heights & Wells Parkway College Heights Dr and Van Buren St Woodberry and College Heights DR, Wells Pkwy and Calverton Dr College Heights and 40th Ave

Tennyson Rd & 40th Ave EB 40th Ave & Underwood 41stAve & Tennyson Rd Van Buren St &44th Ave NWB College Heights Dr & Beechwood Rd SB 44th Ave & Sheridan St NB Pineway & Oakridge Rd Queens Chapel & Van Buren Queens Chapel Rd and Van Buren St Underwood St and Beechwood RD Pineway and Beechwood RD Wells Pkwy and Chansory Ln

CR-68-2025 acknowledges that University Park has sent a letter of request to the County Council (Attachment 1), conducted traffic studies at specified locations (Attachment 1), and passed a local ordinance after a public hearing (Attachment 2).

This resolution implements authority granted by state law (HB-364-2024) and authorized by the passage of CB-84-2024. The State and County legislation require the Prince George's County Police Department to provide a report to the Governor and the Maryland General Assembly on or before December 1, 2025. This report shall include the number of warnings and citations issued, the costs associated with the operation of the systems, monthly revenue collections, and details on the performance, reliability, and effectiveness of the systems in reducing violations, crashes, and pedestrian injuries

After the discussion, the Committee voted Favorably on CR-68-2025 by a vote of 3-0.
