SECTION	1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,

	<b>DIVISION 39. YOUTH COMMISSION.</b>
Sec. 2-489. The	Prince George's County Youth Commission; established.
The Prince	George's County Youth Commission is established to provide the youth of
Prince George's	County with a vehicle to learn about government, participate in the process,
represent and art	iculate the needs of youth in the County, and advise the County Executive and
County Council	on matters pertaining to the youth and teen population, especially as it relates to
County program	<u>s.</u>

1	Sec. 2-490. Duties and responsibilities of Commission.
2	(a) The Commission shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
3	(1) Foster increased youth involvement in the affairs of County government;
4	(2) Study problems and hold forums on issues, activities and concerns of County
5	youth;
6	(3) Comment upon legislation and policies that impact the youth;
7	(4) Present methods to resolve youth-related conflicts between youth, and between
8	youth and adults;
9	(5) Recommend the implementation of community programs to improve the lives of
10	youth;
11	(6) Monitor programs and policies that affect youth to ensure that they are achieving
12	the intended results;
13	(7) Work with other youth organizations in the County to collaborate on shared issues
14	and interest; and
15	(8) Submit to the County Executive and County Council, and make available to the
16	general public, an annual report of the activities of the Commission.
17	Sec. 2-491. Commission composition; term; officers.
18	(a) The Commission shall be composed of 35 youth members appointed by the County
19	Executive and subject to confirmation by the County Council. Youth members shall be selected
20	as to represent each public and private high school in the County and be youth between the ages
21	of 15 and 18 who have a sincere interest in, and motivation to work for, the community and have
22	a background of community-based activity.
23	(b) The term of office for each member shall be one (1) year, with a maximum term of four
24	(4) years for each member. Any vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in the manner of
25	the original appointment. Each member shall serve until a successor is confirmed.
26	(c) The Commission members shall elect annually from their own membership a
27	chairperson and such other officers as it deems necessary.
28	Sec. 2-492. Executive Director; administrative support.
29	There shall be an Executive Director of the Commission and such staff support and
30	facilities as may be authorized and provided in the Office of Human Resources Management.
31	Sec. 2-493. Adoption of rules and regulations.

The Commission shall promulgate its own rules and regulations, subject to the approval of the County Executive, as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the responsibilities of the Commission.

Sec. 2-494. Committees.

(a) The Commission may establish such committees as are deemed necessary and appropriate to assist in its functions and duties. Members of such committees may include nonmembers of the Commission.

(b) Committee actions shall not be deemed to be the action of the Commission and shall in no way bind the Commission or its members.

## Sec. 2-495. Meetings.

The Commission shall meet at the call of the Chairperson or at the request of the majority of the membership, as frequently as required to perform its duties, but no less than once a month. A majority of the members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. A majority of the quorum at any meeting shall be sufficient for any official action taken by the Commission.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
