WHEREAS, the electricity industry is being changed on the federal and state levels from an industry that owns and operates all levels of electricity generation, transmission, and distribution to an industry in which transmission and distribution of electricity will continue to be regulated, while the generation of electricity will be deregulated and subject to an open free-market

Assembly of the Prince George's County Council's concerns about electric utility deregulation in

WHEREAS, meter reading and billing are two other operational areas of the electric utility industry being considered for open competition by the Maryland General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, effective competition in the generation of electricity by independent power producers and non-utility generators has been encouraged through the enactment of the Public Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 and the Energy Policy Act of 1992; and

WHEREAS, Maryland's Public Service Commission directed that competition among electrical providers begin for one-third of the State by July 1, 2000, two-thirds by July 1, 2001, and the entire State by July 1, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the restructuring of state and local economic and taxation policies and practices, developed for an industry of regulated monopolies, to an environment which encourages competition among market participants located within and without the State is very complex and must be managed carefully; and

WHEREAS, it is the General Assembly's responsibility to preside over the debate as to how electric competition in Maryland shall be structured; and

WHEREAS, legislation to allow choice among electric providers is pending in the 1999 Session of the Maryland General Assembly, and

WHEREAS, companion legislation is also pending that will restructure Maryland's personal property tax on electric utilities as well as the gross receipts tax on electric utilities; and

WHEREAS, any tax restructuring proposal may impact on local jurisdictions tax revenues; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council recognizes the complexities confronting the General Assembly in its efforts to balance the myriad of competing interest in moving forward with deregulation of the electric utility industry.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Prince George's County Council requests that the Prince George's County Delegation to the Maryland General Assembly give appropriate weight to the following when considering the deregulation of electric utilities in Maryland:

- 1.) <u>Protect Consumer Rates</u> -- Protect consumers rates by ensuring that customer billing and meter reading is not deregulated and open to competition. These operations should remain a function of the local distribution or transmission monopoly. Deregulated generation costs should be unbundled from all other utility costs on consumers bills so the average consumer can make an informed comparison of competing electric generation companies rates.
- 2.) <u>Social Assistance</u> -- Continue social assistance to low and fixed income consumers to ensure they continue to receive the same social assistance in the free competitive market place that they are now receiving in the regulated market.
- 3.) <u>Tax Restructuring</u> -- Tax restructuring of the gross receipt and the personal property tax on electric utility holdings should, to the extent practicable, have a revenue-neutral effect on local jurisdictions, in essence holding them harmless from the effects of any tax restructuring. The Council urges you to support the Maryland Association of Counties position on tax restructuring, and the Council also urges you to create a fair mechanism to tax restructuring that will simply redistribute the current taxes without offering a tax reduction.
