BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Minimum Wage Indexing

3 For the purpose of indexing Prince George’s County’s minimum wage to the Consumer Price
4 Index.

5 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

6 SUBTITLE 13A. LABOR CODE.

7 Section 13A-117

8 The Prince George's County Code

9 (2023 Edition).

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
11 Maryland, that Section 13A-117 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
12 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

13 SUBTITLE 13A. LABOR CODE.

14 DIVISION 2. MINIMUM WAGE.

15 **Sec. 13A-117. Payment of minimum wage required.**

16 * * * * *

17 (g) Minimum Wage Index

18 (1) Subject to subsection (h) of this section and except as provided in paragraph (3) of
19 this subsection, for the 12-month period beginning January 1, 2026, and each subsequent 12-

1 month period, the minimum wage rate is the minimum wage rate in effect for the immediately
2 preceding 12-month period and the lesser of:

3 (A) The average percentage growth in the Consumer Price Index for the
4 immediately preceding 12-month period, as determined by the Director of Finance under
5 paragraph (2); or

6 (B) five percent (5%).

7 (2) Beginning September 1, 2025, and each September 1 thereafter, the Director of
8 Finance shall determine and announce the average percentage growth, if any, in the Consumer
9 Price Index based on the immediately preceding 12-month Period for which data is available on
10 September 1. The Director of Finance shall utilize the Consumer Price Index for All Urban
11 Consumers (CPI-U) for the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria area published by the Federal
12 Bureau of Labor Statistics.

13 (3) If the Director of Finance determines that there is a decline or no growth in the
14 Consumer Price Index, the minimum wage rate shall remain the same as the rate that was in
15 effect for the immediately preceding 12-month period.

16 (h) Temporary Suspension of Minimum Wage Indexing Due to Negative Employment
17 Growth.

18 (1) Subject to paragraph (4) of this subsection, on or before September 1, 2025, and
19 September 1 each year thereafter, the Director of Finance shall determine whether the seasonally
20 adjusted total employment from the Current Employment Statistics series as reported by the U.S.
21 Bureau of Labor Statistics for the most recent 6-month period is negative as compared with the
22 immediately preceding 6-month period and shall inform the County Council.

23 (2) Subject to paragraph (4) of this subsection, the County Council may temporarily
24 suspend an increase to the minimum wage rate specified under subsection (g) of this section if
25 the County Council determines under paragraph (1) of this subsection that the seasonally
26 adjusted total employment is negative.

27 (3) If the seasonally adjusted total employment is negative, the County Council may
28 consider the performance of County revenues in the previous 6 months, as reported by the
29 Director of Finance, in determining whether to temporarily suspend an increase to the minimum
30 wage rate specified under subsection (g) of this section.

31 (4) If the County Council temporarily suspends an increase to the minimum wage rate

1 specified under subsection (g) of this section:

2 (A) the minimum wage rate in effect for the period beginning the following
3 January 1 shall remain the same as the rate that was in effect for the immediately preceding 12-
4 month period;

5 (B) the remaining minimum wage rates specified in subsection (g) of this section
6 shall take effect 1 year later than the date specified; and

7 (C) the County Council shall notify the Director of Finance that the minimum
8 wage rate increase for the period beginning the following January 1 is suspended for 1 year.

9 (i) To ensure that the wages for Direct Support Professionals (DSP) are commensurate
10 with the professional positions that they occupy, any minimum wage increases that result in the
11 average DSP wage falling twenty percent (20%) below the minimum wage be carefully
12 considered.

13 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
14 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
15 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
16 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
17 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
18 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
19 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
20 or section.

21 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
22 calendar days after it becomes law.
