Fiscal Year 2023 – 2028 Capital Improvement Program Budget Review

Budget Overview

The County Executive's FY 2023 Proposed Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget (the "CIP Budget") expenditures for the Board of Education (the "Board" or "BOE") totals \$197,966,000, an increase of \$26,475,000, or 15.4%, over the approved budget expenditures for FY 2022. The proposed CIP Budget funding is \$69,134,000, or 25.9%, less than the Board of Education's Requested CIP Budget of \$267,100,000. The County's funding contribution through General Obligation Bonds for FY 2023 is \$142,322,000.





County Sources

• County Sources are provided through General Obligation (GO) Bonds. GO Bonds account for 71.9% of FY 2023 funding sources and 69.8% of total project funding sources.


- The County is able to issue General Obligation Bonds to the extent that:
 - 1) The ration of net direct bonded debt to assessed value will not exceed 3.0%, based upon full market value; and
 - 2) The ratio of General Fund net debt service costs (i.e. principal and interest payments less recoveries) to General Fund revenue will not exceed 8.0%.

State Sources

• State sources are the second largest source of funding for the Board of Education's CIP projects. The FY 2023 allocation totals \$52,243,000, representing 26.4% of the total CIP funding.

- State-funded construction projects are approved through the Interagency Commission (IAC) on School Construction. The agency allocates funding for all 24 Maryland jurisdictions and the Maryland School of the Blind. The IAC estimates that 99.82% of the County's request of \$51,334,435 will be funded once 100% of the IAC's FY 2023 CIP Project Recommendations are approved.

Other Sources

- The "Other" funding source includes Video Lottery Terminal (VLT) funding and PAYGO. CB-33-2015 requires that, from FY 2017 on, 50% (up to a maximum of \$25 million) of revenue from VLT facilities be allocated for public education purposes. Part of the revenue is allocated for various operating expenses and a portion is earmarked for CIP.
- The BOE notes that VLT projects are chosen by generating a list of the most-needed projects across all schools in any given County-funded category and then considering a list of those same most-needed projects that are near MGM and/or Rosecroft for specific funding eligibility.
- The proposed FY 2023 funding from "Other Sources" is \$3,401,000, representing 1.7% of the total CIP funding.

Unspent State and County Allocations

• The BOE has unspent County allocations going as far back as FY 2014. A breakdown of unspent GO Bonds and "Other" Sources is below:

• The BOE has unspent State allocations going as far back as FY 2018. Prince George's County accounts for 49.6% of all unspent State allocations, followed by Baltimore City at 33.9% and Baltimore County at 7.3%. A breakdown of unspent State funding is below:

- Over half of the unspent allocations are in the past three (3) fiscal years; however, the Interagency Commission (IAC) on School Construction estimates that unspent allocations lose an estimated 5% of their value every year they remain unspent, due to inflation.
- The BOE administration reports that the primary factor contributing to the unspent allocations is the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, which has disrupted construction and slowed completion of projects.

Proposed FY 2023 Budget Expenditures

- Over 400 active projects and all major construction projects are experiencing cost increases. The BOE notes a trend shared by regional, State, and global entities in the construction industry.
- The BOE lays out the following process for selecting which schools are to receive projects in any given year:
 - o Asbestos, ADA Upgrades, Buried Fuel Tanks, Code Corrections, Lead Remediation, AC-HVAC, Major Repairs, Parking Lots, and Playgrounds are selected by a Planning Team.
 - The Department of Capital Programs meets with Building Services to analyze data compiled throughout the year from the Work Order System, Facility Coordinators, Planners, and Leads from each of the nine (9) Building Services shops.
- According to the October 2021 "Maintenance of Maryland's Public School Buildings FY 2021 Annual Report" by the IAC, Prince George's County scored 66.49% (Not Adequate) in the LEA Average rating. Four (4) of the five (5) major deficiencies identified in the State were located in the County. The IAC notes that to ensure the continued effectiveness and expected lifespan of a facility, adequate maintenance on a virtually ongoing basis is required. The Building Services unit is not within the Department of Capital Programs; however, the need to keep adequate school facilities links the two units.

School Construction and Renovation Projects

 - o Funding includes \$8,127,000 GO Bonds and \$21,973,000 from the State.

- FY 2023 funding supports systemic replacements in H. Winship Wheatley ECC HVAC Replacement, Charles H. Flowers HS roof replacement, and Phyllis E. Williams ES HVAC replacement.
- Category has a shortfall of \$5,000,000 for financial closeouts. The administration notes that, if necessary, a reallocation of funds may occur to close out the projects.

Miscellaneous State-Funded Projects

Aging Schools Program (ASP)

- Category includes funding to address the needs of aging school buildings. Funds support projects with at least a 15-year anticipated lifespan.
- FY 2023 Proposed Expenditures: \$1,000,000.
 - o Funding includes \$1,000,000 from State funds.

Forward Funded Projects

- Category provides State reimbursement of County funds used to construct eligible school construction projects for which State funds have not yet been allocated.
- No funding or expenditures are proposed for FY 2023.

Prior CIP Project Completion Status

- As of February 2022, out of 763 active projects, 316, or 41%, of all active projects are currently in a "Final Completion" (closeout approval requested) status and 181, or 24%, are in a "Substantially Complete" status.
- The chart and graph below show the projects, substantially completed before February 2022, which are awaiting financial closeouts.
