3. PROPOSED CORRESPONDENCE/ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

4. <u>SECOND READING OF BILLS – (INTRODUCTION)</u>

<u>CB-25-2003 (DR-2) – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING L-A-C ZONE</u> for the purpose of exempting certain dwelling units in proximity to the Metro Station from certain site and building design guidelines and regulations, and limitations on the number of townhouses and multifamily dwellings in the L-A-C Zone. - <u>AMENDED;DR-3 INTRODUCED</u>

Council Bill 25 modifies certain site and building design guidelines and regulations for townhouses and multifamily dwellings in the M-X-T zone for land in proximity to a Metro station and applies consistent guidelines and regulations in the L-A-C zone for certain developments within proximity to Metro stations. Council Bill 25 was favorably reported out of PZED on 5/14/2003 with amendments.

Council Member Harrington proffered amendment number one to Council Bill 25, Draft 2; seconded by Council Member Hendershot. The motion carried 9-0. Council Bill 25, Draft 3 was introduced by Council Members Harrington, Dean and Peters.

5. PUBLIC HEARINGS/BILL ELIGIBLE FOR THIRD READING – (ENACTMENT)

<u>CB-14-2003 (DR-2) – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING COMMERCIAL PARKING</u>
<u>LOTS</u> for the purpose of permitting commercial parking lots in the C-O Zone under certain circumstances. - <u>PUBLIC HEARING HELD</u>; <u>ENACTED</u>

(Introduced by Council Members Hendershot and Dean on 4/8/2003; favorably reported out of PZED on 3/26/2003 with amendments)

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened for Council Bill 14, Draft 2. Mr. Jacques Chevalier II spoke in support of the measure. All persons wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Hendershot moved enactment; seconded by Council Member Dean. The motion carried 9-0.

6. **PUBLIC HEARING - (ELIGIBLE FOR ENACTMENT)**

<u>CB-8-2003 (DR-2) – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING CLASS 3 FILLS</u> for the purpose of defining class 3 fills, requiring a special exception for class 3 fills in all zones where they are permitted and providing a limitation on grading permit renewals for Class 3 fills. - <u>PUBLIC</u> HEARING HELD; RECOMMITTED TO PZED

(Introduced by Council Members Dean, Shapiro, Exum and Harrington on 4/8/2003; favorably reported out of PZED on 3/26/2003 with amendments)

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on Council Bill 8, Draft 2. Mr. Jacques Cevalier II, spoke in support of the legislation, while Mr. Larry Taub, Mr. Larry Cortano, Ms. Mary Murphy and Mr. Daryl Harris suggested that Council refer this item to committee for additional discussion. All persons wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Harrington moved to recommit Council Bill 8, Draft 2 to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee; seconded by Council Member Hendershot. The motion carried 8-1 (Opposed: Council Member Exum).
