BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Clean Communities Transparency Dashboard Act of 2026

3 For the purpose of requiring the Office of Community Relations to create a Clean Communities
4 Transparency Dashboard to inform residents of the County’s illegal dumping and litter clean-up
5 efforts; identifying data to be made available on the Dashboard; requiring regular updating of the
6 contents of the Dashboard; and generally relating to open data.

8 SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION

9 Section 2-551.01,

10 The Prince George's County Code

11 (2023 Edition; 2025 Supplement).

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
13 Maryland, that Section 2-551.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
14 added:

15 SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION.

16 DIVISION 48. OPEN DATA.

17 **Sec. 2-551.01. Clean Communities Transparency Dashboard**

18 (a) Clean Communities Transparency Dashboard established. The Office of
19 Community Relations, as part of its management of the PGC311 program, shall maintain on its
20 website a dashboard through which residents can access data and information related to County
21 clean-up of illegal dumping and litter and responsiveness to resident reports of incidents of

1 illegal dumping and litter.

2 (b) Contents. The Clean Communities Transparency Dashboard maintained pursuant to
3 this Section shall contain data and information including, but not limited to:

- 4 (1) the total number and location of illegal dumping and litter incidents in the
- 5 County;
- 6 (2) the number and location of illegal dumping and litter incidents reported via
- 7 PGC311;
- 8 (3) the number of citations issued for dumping and illegal litter violations;
- 9 (4) the number of citations for which fines have been collected;
- 10 (5) the dollar amount of fines collected; and
- 11 (6) the locations of identifiable problem areas or hotspots for illegal dumping and
- 12 litter.

13 (c) Updates. The Office of Community Relations shall update the Clean Communities
14 Transparency Dashboard regularly and not less than monthly.

15 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
16 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
17 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
18 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
19 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
20 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
21 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
22 or section.

23 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
24 calendar days after it becomes law.
