PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 10/21/99

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0, (In favor: Council Members Wilson, Hendershot, Maloney, Russell and Scott).

This bill will amend the Classification Plan by assigning Emergency Rescue Technicians classes of work to their own salary schedule. Also, this legislation accompanies the new collective bargaining agreement (CB-77-1999) between the County and the International Association of Fire Fighters, Local 1619, covering a new bargaining unit of Emergency Response Technicians.

There will be no negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of enacting CB-76-1999.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT**(Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)**

The Classification Plan is being amended for the purpose of assigning certain existing classes of work to the bargaining unit represented by the International Association of Fire Fighters, Local 1619. This legislation accompanies the new Collective Bargaining Agreement between Prince George's County, Maryland and the International Association of Fire Fighters, Local 1619 covering a new bargaining unit of Emergency Response Technicians. The Classification Plan further amends existing pay plans by adding new classes and changes to grades of existing classes. The fiscal impact will be provided by the Office of Management and Budget.
