**PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT** Date: 6/6/96

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0 (In favor: Council Members Estepp, Bailey, Del Giudice,  
Maloney and Scott).

This resolution provides supplementary appropriations of grant funds totaling \$1,024,713 to several departments. Also, there are decreases where anticipated grants were not awarded or were reduced by the granting agency. The Police Department and Corrections Department received new grants which were not anticipated in the FY96 budget.

The Director of Finance has certified in writing that the amount of \$1,024,713 is available or is anticipated from revenue or grants not included in the current fiscal year.

The Office of Law has found the resolution to be legally sufficient.

There should not be any negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CR-24-1996.
