	Stop Sign Monitoring Systems – City of Glenarden
For the purpose of providing County Council approval of locations for stop sign monitoring	
systems in the City of Glenarden, and generally regarding stop sign monitoring systems.	
WHEREAS, the City of Glenarden seeks County Council approval for installing Stop Sign	
Enforcement Cameras Pursuant to the Md. Transportation Article, Sec. 21-707.1(c)(2)(i) and	
Sec. 21-707.1(c)(ii) and Prince Georges County Code, Sec. 26-120.02(c)(2)(B) and Sec 26-	
120.02(c)(2)(C), Attachment 1 - City of Glenarden Stop Sign Ordinance, Attachment 4; and	
WHEREAS, Md. Transportation Article, Sec. 21-707.1(c)(2)(i) authorizes the use of stop	
sign monitoring systems on highways located in a school zone maintained by a local jurisdiction	
f authorized by the governing body of the local jurisdiction, Attachment 1 – O-11-2025,	
Attachment 3 – Public Hearing Minutes; and	
WHEREAS, Md. Transportation Article, Sec. 21-707.1(c)(2)(ii) and Prince George's	
County Code Sec. 26-120.02(c)(2)(B) state that a stop sign monitoring system may only be used	
at a location approved by the Prince George's County Council; and	
WHEREAS, Prince George's County Code, Sec. 26-120.02(c)(2)(C) provides that Council	
approval of stop sign monitoring systems used by municipalities shall be made by Council	
resolution upon receipt of a request letter from the municipality, Attachment 4; and	
WHEREAS, the County Council is in receipt of a letter dated April 24, 2025, from Charles	

Simpson, City Manager, Glenarden, requesting approval for six stop sign monitoring system

locations based on traffic study data, high violation rates, and the need to improve safety for

schoolchildren and pedestrians; and

WHEREAS, traffic studies at intersections throughout the City of Glenarden revealed alarming daily stop sign violation rates, underscoring a clear public safety hazard; and

WHEREAS, Attachment 4 provides the list of locations identified for stop sign monitoring systems for which the City of Glenarden is seeking approval; and

WHEREAS, the City of Glenarden will utilize stop sign camera monitoring systems to provide continuous deterrence, freeing police officers to address more critical calls and improving public safety throughout the City and County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the County Council hereby approves the locations for stop sign monitoring systems for the City of Glenarden, as set forth above and in the letter from Charles Simpson, City Manager, Glenarden April 24, 2025, which is made a part of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, Attachment 1, Attachment 2, Attachment 3, and Attachment 4 are made a part of this Resolution as a part thereof and a part herein.
