A RESOLUTION concerning

A Supplementary Appropriation of Federal, State and Other Funds

For the purpose of providing additional funding from grants in the amount of \$2,534,087 to the

Human Relations Commission, Office of the State's Attorney, Department of Corrections, Police

Department, Fire/EMS Department, Health Department and the Department of Family Services.

WHEREAS, CB-28-1999, as amended, adopted and enacted the annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance of Prince George's County for FY1999-2000, which sets forth the amount of grant funds to be appropriated; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 819 of the Charter for Prince George's County, Maryland, the County Council may, upon recommendation of the County Executive, make additional or supplementary appropriations from Federal, State, or private grants which were not included in the budget for Fiscal Year 1999-2000; and

WHEREAS, additional grant revenues have been received; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive has duly recommended that the supplementary appropriations be made;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Fiscal Year 1999-2000 Approved Current Expense Budget, Federal Programs Section, as amended, is revised by supplementary appropriations as follows:

Human Relations Commission

ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION GRANT (\$5,000) - These grant funds will support a position designated to expand the conflict mediation services of the Commission.

Office of the State's Attorney

TEEN COURT PROGRAM (\$40,000) - This award from the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention supports a Teen Court Coordinator and program-related costs.

Department of Corrections

ENHANCED SUPERVISION PROGRAM (\$45,000) - This grant from the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention will support costs of additional personnel to expand alternatives to incarceration.

Police Department

Three existing grants are receiving supplementary awards totaling \$48,100.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM (\$30,032) - A grant for \$30,032 from the Police and Correctional Training Commission supports professional development training.

HIDTA: CROSS BORDER TASK FORCE (\$212,500) - This new grant supports a cross border partnership to reduce drug trafficking.

DEA: CROSS BORDER TASK FORCE (\$48,100) - These funds will reimburse overtime of officers assigned to a task force attempting to disrupt illicit drug traffic across the borders of the District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia.

HIDTA/PROJECT CLEAN (\$71,000) - This new award reimburses overtime for drug enforcement activities targeted to police districts three and four.

US CUSTOMS TASK FORCE (\$10,000) - This grant will reimburse overtime of officers assigned to joint investigations of US Customs cases.

JENNING INVESTIGATION (\$6,600) - The Police Department assisted the Washington Metropolitan Area Task Force (US Department of Justice) with their drug investigation.

FOREIGN VEHICLE REGISTRATION (\$20,000) - \$20,000 from the Maryland State Police will assist in addressing the problem of improperly registered vehicles.

Fire/EMS Department

PROJECT IMPACT (\$315,000) - This grant is used to build disaster resistant communities. Funds will be utilized as seed money to begin the process of mitigation and prevention in some of the County's most disaster-prone areas.

Health Department

Supplementals were received in Addictions, Maternal and Child Health and the Office of the Health Officer. These additions will be used to handle increased workloads throughout the Division.

YOUNG FATHERS/RESPONSIBLE FATHERS (\$63,244) - This grant provides support services to young men and young fathers which promotes a healthy environment for children.

PROJECT CONNECT (\$20,802) - This grant will develop a comprehensive approach to counseling and testing, partner notification and referral services, and prevention case management to ensure access to treatment, and reduce high risk behavior and potential transmission of HIV.

NEEDS ASSESSMENT (\$40,000) - This grant will assess the public health needs in the community.

Department of Family Services

REFUGEE PROJECT (MONA) (\$16,082) - This grant, provided by the Maryland Department of Aging, will be used to improve the access to Aging services by older refugees and their families.

CURB ABUSE MEDICARE/MEDICAID (\$16,023) - The purpose of this program is to reduce the amount of Federal and State funds lost due to health insurance fraud by increasing the public's ability to detect and report possible fraud, waste and abuse.

QUALITY CHILD CARE (\$152,975) - The quality child care program is a State pass-through grant from the Department of Human Resources through the Department of Family Services to the Prince George's Child Resource Center to provide child care resources and referrals to 120 teen parents to ensure that they remain in or return to school.
