	Historic Site Designation of County Properties
For the purpose of	of designating the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Exchange/Old Stone
Building (79-117	7) and the Wagner House (83-032) as Prince George's County historic sites.
WHEREAS, Section 29-120.01 of the Prince George's County Code provides a process for	
the owner(s) of a	n historic property to petition for designation as an historic site with the Prince
George's County	Historic Preservation Commission; and
WHEREAS	s, as authorized by County law, record owner Prince George's County Office of
Central Services for the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Exchange/Old Stone Building,	
located at 14500 Church Street, Upper Marlboro, petitioned for consideration and designation as	
an historic site by	y the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission; and
WHEREAS	s, after consideration of the petition, the Historic Preservation Commission
found that the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Exchange/Old Stone Building meets two of the	
nine criteria for designation as an historic site set forth in Section 29-104(a) of the Prince	
George's County Code, namely Criterion (1)(A)(IV), as it is a building that housed one of the	
largest public service agencies in the state of Maryland, the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone	
Exchange, which exemplifies the cultural, economic, industrial, social, political or historical	
heritage of the County and its urban and rural communities; and Criterion (2)(A)(V), as the	
Historic Preservation Commission found the building serves as an example of a stone utilitarian	

building existing at the juncture of two historic roadways, and the location of the building

represents an established and familiar visual feature of the neighborhood, community, or County, due to its singular physical characteristics or landscape; and

WHEREAS, as authorized by County law, record owner Holliday B. Wagner for the Wagner House, located at 1910 Bryan Point Road, Accokeek, petitioned for consideration and designation as an historic site by the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of the petition, the Historic Preservation Commission found that the Wagner House is significant as the first post-World War II Modern Movement house constructed in Accokeek, as a notable work of Charles F. Wagner, Jr., l designer and builder linked to the colony's early days, as well as the area's postwar reimagining as the Moyoane Reserve, which is an environmental preserve for family life; and

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Commission found that the Wagner House meets seven of the nine historic site designation criteria of Section 29-104(a), Prince George's County Code, Historic and Cultural Significance Criteria (1)(A)(i), (1)(A)(iii), (1)(A)(iv); and Architectural and Design Significance Criteria (2)(A)(i), (2)(A) (ii), (2)(A)(iii), (2)(A)(v); and

WHEREAS, it is the finding of the District Council that each of the properties serves as a significant example of their respective types, periods of construction, and locations; and

WHEREAS, after proper posting and notice was given as required by law, the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission conducted respective public hearings on the subject petitions for designation on December 15, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Commission recommended that the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Exchange/Old Stone Building (79-117) and its 0.119-acre Environmental Setting (part of Triangle Lot EQ 5180 square feet, Tax Map 101, Grid E-2); the Wagner House (83-032) and its Environmental Setting and its 12.06-acre Environmental Setting (Parcel 73, Tax Map 150, Grid F-2, Bond's Retreat), qualify for historic site designation based on the historic site designation criteria described above; and WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council, sitting as the District Council, and the Prince

George's County Planning Board of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission held a duly advertised joint public hearing on the significance of these properties with the Prince George's County Planning Board on April 5, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the District Council further finds that after a fifteen-day period for further

1 written comment, the record of public hearing testimony April 20, 2016, without any further 2 testimony submitted to the public hearing record; and 3 WHEREAS, after consideration of the administrative record for each petition, as well as the record of joint public hearing testimony, the Prince George's County Planning Board voted 4 5 unanimously 4-0 on April 28, 2016, to recommend the designation of the Chesapeake & 6 Potomac Telephone Exchange/Old Stone Building and the Wagner House as historic sites in 7 Prince George's County. 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's 9 County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington 10 Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Exchange/Old Stone Building (79-117), 14500 Church Street, Upper Marlboro, and 11 the Wagner House (83-032), 1910 Bryan Point Road, Accokeek,, are hereby designated as Prince 12 13 George's County historic sites. 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Council be directed to mail copies of 15 this Resolution to the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission, the Prince 16 George's Planning Board, The Prince George's County Office of Central Services, and Ms. 17 Holliday B. Wagner. Adopted this 31st day of May, 2016.
