LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Fiscal Policy and Government Operations
Committee Report

Date: November 12, 1991

Committee Vote: Hold in Committee, 3-2 (In favor: Council Members MacKinnon, Castaldi and Fletcher; Opposed: Council Members Bell and Mills)

This bill will include a \$15 fee to be charged for the issuance of a new certificate in the new name for the remainder of the registration year.

Ed Smallwood, Taxicab Board, stated in a memo that the Taxicab Board has not reviewed this legislation.

Council Member Mills stated that the Department of Environmental Resources has steadfastly opposed this legislation.

Jim Osborne, DER, said that DER does not want to see "transferability" unregulated. Also, they have included "transferability" in their rewrite of Subtitle 20 which should come before the Council during the next session.

The Committee agreed to hold this legislation until January 15, 1992, thereby allowing DER the opportunity to submit legislation to the Council which will include the revision of Subtitle 20.

The Legislative Officer has reviewed this legislation and finds it to be in proper legislative form.

There should not be any negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CB-112-1991.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed legislation would allow a certificate holder for a vehicle properly registered to transfer the certificate to a partnership, company, corporation or other organization in which the certificate holder is an owner. A fee of \$15.00 would be charged for the issuance of a new certificate in the new name for the remainder of the registration year.
