EXPLANATORY STATEMENT: This is an Emergency Ordinance to address a timing issue that arises as a result of the interplay between Section 210 of the Town Charter and Article 28, Section 8-112.1, of the Maryland Code.

Section 8-112.1 authorizes municipalities in Prince George's County to adopt limited zoning regulations. This Ordinance is a "zoning ordinance" within the meaning of Section 8-112.1 since it addresses the regulation of residential storage. Section 8-112.1 requires the Prince George's County Council to approve any such ordinance before it becomes effective. The Town must deliver a certified copy of this adopted zoning ordinance to the District Council (County Council) "within five days after enactment of the ordinance and at least 30 days prior to the effective date of the ordinance." A zoning ordinance that is not approved by the District Council "before the effective date of the ordinance shall be considered disapproved and may not take effect."

Section 210(b) of the Town Charter provides that, except in the case of an emergency ordinance, a Town ordinance "shall become effective at the expiration of twenty (20) calendar days following passage by the council. Any emergency ordinance shall become effective on the date specified in the ordinance...."

Using the regular effective date of 20 calendar days after passage, the Town could never satisfy the Section 8-112.1 requirement that an ordinance be delivered to the County Council at least 30 days before its effective date. By adopting an ordinance as an emergency ordinance the Town Council can specify any effective date. In this Emergency Ordinance the effective date is 20 days after its approval by the District Council. Since this Emergency Ordinance by its terms would take effect only after the District Council approves it, the Section 8-112.1 requirement would be satisfied. Now, therefore,

 SECTION 1: BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF RIVERDALE PARK, That new Section 50-16 is hereby added to the Code of the Town of Riverdale Park (January 2008 Revision), Chapter 50 – Peace and Good Order, to follow immediately after Section 50-15 and to read as follows:

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Chapter 50 - Peace and Good Order

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§ 50-16. DUMPSTERS AND STORAGE RECEPTACLES ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY.

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NO DUMPSTER OR OTHER RECEPTACLE FOR THE TEMPORARY STORAGE OR TRANSPORT OF CONSTRUCTION OR OTHER DEBRIS, OR FOR THE TEMPORARY STORAGE OF HOUSEHOLD OR OTHER ITEMS, GREATER IN SIZE THAN THREE CUBIC YARDS, SHALL BE PLACED ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY WITHOUT A PERMIT ISSUED BY THE TOWN. PERMITS SHALL EXPIRE NOT LATER THAN 60 90 DAYS AFTER ISSUANCE, AND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO SUCH FURTHER CONDITIONS AS THE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR MAY REQUIRE. THE COST OF A PERMIT IS TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$25). A PERMIT MAY BE EXTENDED FOR UP TO AN ADDITIONAL 60 90 DAYS IN ANY TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD BY THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TOWN ADMINISTRATOR UPON PAYMENT OF A TWENTY-FIVE DOLLAR (\$25) EXTENSION FEE, AND THEREAFTER BY THE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR FOR UP TO AN ADDITIONAL 90 DAYS IN THE SAME PERIOD UPON GOOD CAUSE SHOWN AND PAYMENT OF AN ADDITIONAL TWENTY-FIVE DOLLAR (\$25) EXTENSION FEE. ANY FURTHER EXTENSION WITHIN THE SAME PERIOD MAY BE AUTHORIZED ONLY BY THE TOWN COUNCIL FOR A PERIOD OF UP TO AN ADDITIONAL 90 DAYS UPON A SHOWING OF EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCE AND PAYMENT OF AN ADDITIONAL TWENTY-FIVE DOLLAR (\$25) EXTENSION FEE. THE FEE FOR A PERMIT ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION IS \$100.00.

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SECTION 2: AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that Section 50-18.c) of the Code of the Town of Riverdale Park (January 2008 Revision), Chapter 50 – Peace and Good Order, is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

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§ 50-18. Penalties.

112 113 114 c) Violations of the provisions of §§50-4 through 50-10, and 50-12, and 50-15 AND 50-16 are municipal infractions, the penalty for which shall be one hundred dollars (100) (\$100) for each offense, except for violations of §50-12, the penalty for which shall be fifty dollars (50) (\$50) for each offense.

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SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that a certified copy of this Emergency Ordinance shall be sent to the Prince George's District Council within five (5) days after enactment.

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SECTION 4: AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that, having been passed


