Staff provided a summary of the resolution and referral comments that were received. CR-28-2009 approves a revised planning and administration budget and staffing plan for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program, (NSP). A representative the Redevelopment Authority provided additional information to the Committee.

The Office of Law determined that CR-28-2009 was in proper legislative form.

The Office of Audits and Investigation indicated there will be a positive fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CR-28-2009.

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**BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:**

On March 24, 2009, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (“HUD”) approved the NSP Substantial Amendment allowing the Prince George’s County Department of Housing and Community Development to use NSP funds for eligible costs associated with down payment and closing cost assistance, acquisition, rehabilitation, housing counseling, planning, and administration in the amount of \$10,883,234. In order to adequately staff the NSP initiative and to ensure that HUD’s performance measures and timeliness requirements are met, this resolution approves an increase in the planning and administration budget and a revised staffing plan.
