Committee Vote: Favorable, 3-0-1, (In favor: Council Members Wilson, Maloney and Scott. Abstained: Estepp).

This bill will amend the Classification Plan by assigning Emergency Dispatcher IV at Grade 21 to a new class of work on the appropriate wage scale (CR-35-2000) for employees represented by the Police Civilian Employees Association (PCEA).

There are six (6) employees presently occupying Emergency Dispatcher III positions on the PCEA scale. If all six employees are reallocated to Emergency Dispatcher IV, Grade 21, after the effective date of this legislation, the cost to the County from the reallocation in FY2001 would be approximately \$40,400. With the inclusion of fringe benefits, at 23% of payroll, the

total cost of the reallocation is approximately \$49,700.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

The Classification Plan is being amended for the purpose of assigning certain existing classes of work to the bargaining unit represented by Prince George's County Police Civilian Employees Association. The companion resolution establishes three new grade levels (P19, P20 and P21). The fiscal impact will be provided by the Office of Management and Budget.
