10	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,			
11	Maryland, that Section 4-111 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby			
12	repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

19	(j) Section 105.6 is added to read as follows: "Rural Tier." Where the property is located			
20	in the Rural Tier, as delineated in the Approved General Plan, the number of building permits fo			
21	the construction of residential dwelling units is limited to not more than one percent of total			

annual average number of residential completions, as determined by the Planning Board, for the two most recent calendar years. The Planning Board shall develop a system to determine the number of building permits allowed to be issued each year, account for each building permit issued, and maintain a waiting list or other method of allocating building permits in successive period; if the annual allocation of building permits is exhausted in any particular year.

- (1) Building permits for the construction of a single family dwelling to be constructed on land that is exempt from the requirement of filing a subdivision plat pursuant to Section 24-107(c)(1), (2), or (3) are not subject to the limitation imposed by this section.
- (2) Building permits for the construction of a single family dwelling to be constructed to replace an existing dwelling that has been destroyed or that will be demolished are not subject to the limitation imposed by this section.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that in accordance with the provisions of Section 317 of the Charter, the County Council hereby declares that a public emergency exists affecting the public health, safety, and welfare; said emergency being the need to protect the natural and built environment of the Rural Tier by limiting the construction of dwellings in the Rural Tier in accordance with the Approved General Plan of Prince George's County.
