Current Law/Background:

Section 815 of the Charter of Prince George's County, Maryland authorizes the County Council, upon recommendation of the County Executive, to provide by Resolution additional or supplementary appropriations from Federal, State or private grants which were not included in the budget for the current fiscal year.

Discussion/Policy Analysis:

CR-042-2020 seeks to provide supplementary appropriations of \$191,257,202 to grant programs in FY 2020 to support programmatic operations within the following agencies: Circuit Court, Office of the State's Attorney, Fire/EMS Department, Department of Public Works and Transportation, Health Department, Department of Social Services, Department of Family Services, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Homeland Security, Police Department, Office of the Sheriff and Department of Corrections.

The "Explanation of Adjustments" attached to CR-042-2020, provides a summary of the various proposed grant adjustments for each agency. The proposed grant funding reflects \$190,647,034 in Federal award allocations, and \$610,168 in required County Cash

Fiscal Impact:

Direct Impact

Adoption of CR-042-2020 should have a positive fiscal impact on the County's FY 2020 budget by appropriating an additional \$190,647,034 in Outside Source funding to reflect actual grant program efforts related to various programs and initiatives. The grant awards require a County Cash match of \$610,168, however, this immaterial amount in comparison to the overall total of anticipated grant funds should not have an adverse fiscal impact on the County.

Indirect Impact

Adoption of CR-042-2020 will assist County agencies in supporting current programmatic operations that benefit residents using funds from outside sources. This allows the continuance of programs and service without a reliance upon County funding
