RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

The Listing of Local Questions on the 2006 Ballot

For the purpose of designating the order and form in which local questions shall be placed on the 2006 ballot and matters related thereto.

WHEREAS, Section 7-103 (a) of the Election Law Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland provides that the County Attorney shall designate the order and form in which local questions shall be placed on the ballot; and

WHEREAS, Section 1105 of the Charter of Prince George's County, Maryland provides that proposed amendments to the Charter may be proposed by legislative act approved by not less than a two-thirds majority of the full County Council; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County Council to prescribe the form and order in which local questions shall be placed on the ballot; and

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Schedule of Legislation provides that the County Attorney shall be the legal advisor and legislative draftsman of the County Council unless the Council shall specifically direct otherwise; and

WHEREAS, in each legislative act enacted by the Council that is subject to referendum of the voters, the language to be considered by the voters is specifically enacted as part of the proposed Charter amendment or referendum question; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has determined that the order of referendum questions on the 2006 ballot is a significant element of the Council's role to propose Charter amendments and approve other questions for submission to the voters by referendum and that the County Attorney should be informed and directed concerning the Council's determination in fulfilling his

1 obligations pursuant to the Election Law Article; and 2 WHEREAS, Section 1017 (c) of the Charter of Prince George's County, Maryland provides 3 that a resolution of the County Council has the force and effect of law of a temporary or 4 administrative character. 5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's 6 County, Maryland, that the County Attorney is directed to certify the order and form of the 7 questions to the local board of elections in accordance with the provisions of Section 7-103 (b) of 8 the Election Law Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland as follows: 9 10 **QUESTION A** 11 (CB-58-2006) 12 PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 13 To provide a statement of the County's policy to encourage and support local and minority 14 business in the County; to amend the time for Council consideration of the proposed County budget; to provide that the annual budget document contain forecasts of goods and services that 15 16 would necessitate competitive bidding; and to provide that reports of certain positions in the 17 exempt service be submitted semi-annually. 18 19 **QUESTION B** 20 (CB-70-2006) 21 PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 22 To provide that the staffing level of any agency approved in the annual operating budget may not be increased without prior approval of the Council. 23 24 25 **QUESTION C** 26 (CB-72-2006) 27 PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 28 To provide that the revenue estimates in the proposed operating budget may be increased 29 or decreased by the Council by no more than one percent. 30 31

QUESTION D 1 2 (CB-60-2006)PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 3 4 To increase the powers of the County Auditor to perform investigations; and to provide 5 protection to County employees for providing information to the County Auditor during an 6 investigation. 7 8 **QUESTION E** 9 (CB-59-2006) 10 PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 11 To amend the prescribed scheduling and notice periods for legislation by the Clerk of the 12 Council; to amend the time for presentation of enacted bills to the County Executive; and to 13 authorize amendments to the County legislative process during an emergency declared by the 14 Governor for matters relating to and responsive to the emergency. 15 **QUESTION F** 16 17 (CB-74-2006) 18 PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 19 To provide an approval process for the making of certain contracts providing for the 20 payment of funds at a time beyond the fiscal year in which the contract is made. 21 22 **QUESTION G** 23 (CB-73-2006) PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 24 25 To provide an approval process for certain intrafund transfers of appropriations within 26 County agencies. 27 **QUESTION H** 28 (CB-71-2006) 29 PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT 30 To allow additional time for holding a public hearing on executive appointments and 31 providing that failure to act within forty-five days shall constitute approval.

QUESTION I 1 2 (CB-50-2006) 3 LIBRARY FACILITIES BONDS 4 An Act enabling the County to borrow money and issue bonds in an amount not exceeding 5 \$11,288,000 to finance the design, construction, reconstruction, extension, acquisition, 6 improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation or repair of Library 7 Facilities, as defined therein. 8 9 **QUESTION J** 10 (CB-49-2006) 11 PUBLIC WORKS AND TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES BONDS 12 An Act enabling the County to borrow money and issue bonds in an amount not exceeding 13 \$62,327,000 to finance the design, construction, reconstruction, extension, acquisition, 14 improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation or repair of Public 15 Works and Transportation Facilities (including roads and bridges, parking lots, and maintenance 16 facilities), as defined therein. 17 **QUESTION K** 18 (CB-51-2006) PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES BONDS 19 20 An Act enabling the County to borrow money and issue bonds in an amount not exceeding 21 \$9,259,000 to finance the design, construction, reconstruction, extension, acquisition, 22 improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation or repair of Public 23 Safety Facilities (including Fire Department Facilities), as defined therein. 24 25 **QUESTION L** 26 (CB-52-2006) 27 **COUNTY BUILDINGS BONDS** 28 An Act enabling the County to borrow money and issue bonds in an amount not exceeding 29 \$15,600,000 to finance the design, construction, reconstruction, extension, acquisition, 30 improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation or repair of County 31 Buildings, as defined therein.

4	An Act enabling the County to borrow money and issue bonds in an amount not exceeding
5	\$15,499,000 to finance the design, construction, reconstruction, extension, acquisition,
6	improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation or repair of
7	Community College Facilities, as defined therein.

9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any petition for Charter Amendment or for
10	referendum is hereafter filed that meets all requirements of law, the County Attorney is hereby
11	directed to prepare and certify said question to the local board of elections in accordance with the
12	provisions of Section 7-103 (b) of the Election Law Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the
14	Board of Supervisors of Elections for Prince George's County by the Clerk of the Council.
