### REPORT:

Committee Vote: Favorable, 3-0 (In Favor: Council Members Olson, Harrison, and Dernoga)

The Committee convened on June 12, 2025, to discuss CR-70-2025, which approves four (4) locations for stop sign monitoring systems in the Town of Fairmount Heights:

59th & J (WB on J) - 1 camera

60th & L (NB on 60<sup>th</sup>) - 1 camera

56th & Kolb (EB on Kolb) - 1 camera

60th & Field (NB on 60<sup>th</sup>) - 1 camera

CR-70-2025 acknowledges that Fairmount Heights has sent a letter of request to the County Council (Attachment 1), conducted traffic studies at specified locations (Attachment 1), and passed a local ordinance (Attachment 2) after a public hearing (Attachment 3).

This resolution implements authority granted by state law (HB-364-2024) and authorized in Prince George's by the passage of CB-84-2024. The State and County legislation require the Prince George's County Police Department to provide a report to the Governor and the Maryland General Assembly on or before December 1, 2025.

This report shall include:

The number of warnings and citations issued,

The costs associated with the operation of the systems,  
monthly revenue collections, and

Details on the performance, reliability, and effectiveness of the systems in reducing violations,  
crashes, and pedestrian injuries

After the discussion, the Committee voted Favorably on CR-70-2025 by a vote of 3-0.
