EMERGENCY BILL

AN EMERGENCY ACT concerning

Transfer Tax

For the purpose of continuing the transfer tax rate at 1.4%; eliminating scheduled reductions in the transfer tax rate; and making this Act an emergency measure.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

Section 10-188,

The Prince George's County Code

(1995 Edition, 1996 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 10-188 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

DIVISION 7. TAXES AND TAX CREDITS.

Subdivision 1. Transfer and Recordation Taxes.

Sec. 10-188. Transfer tax; computation; collection; instrument of writing; deferral or abatement.

(a) A tax is imposed at the rate of one and four-tenths percent (1.4%) of actual consideration paid or to be paid under every instrument of writing conveying title to real property, or any interest therein, in the County, offered for record and recorded in the County[; provided,

however, that the	rate shall be	reduced to	one and three	tenths percen	at (1.3%) begin	nning July 1,	
1997; one and two-tenths percent (1.2%) beginning July 1, 1998; one and one-tenth percent							
(1.1%) beginning	July 1, 199	99; and shal	ll be one per	cent (1%) beg	ginning July 1	, 2000, and

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that in accordance with the provisions of Section 317 of the Charter, the County Council hereby declares that a public emergency exists affecting the public health, safety, and welfare; said emergency being the need to secure revenues for the County by the continuation of the transfer tax rate of 1.4%.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on the date it becomes law.

Adopted this <u>3rd</u> day of <u>June</u>, 1997, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the full County Council.
