**BILL**

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Weapons

3 For the purpose of amending certain language in the County Code regarding weapons to be  
4 consistent with State law.

5 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

6 SUBTITLE 14. MORALS AND CONDUCT.

7 Section 14-141,

8 The Prince George's County Code

9 (1995 Edition, 1998 Supplement).

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,  
11 Maryland, that Section 14-141 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby  
12 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

13 SUBTITLE 14. MORALS AND CONDUCT.

14 DIVISION 6. WEAPONS.

15 **Sec. 14-141. Transfer of weapon to minor prohibited; exceptions.**

16 (a) No person shall give, sell, rent, lend or otherwise transfer any gun or weapon described  
17 in Section 14-140, designed to use explosive ammunition or any projectile therefor, within the  
18 County to a minor under the age of seventeen (17) years, except where the relationship of parent  
19 and child, guardian and ward or adult instructor and pupil exists between such person and the  
20 minor.

21 (b) This Section shall not apply to any [pistols or revolvers] regulated firearms regulated

1 by Sections 441 to 448, Article 27, Annotated Code of Maryland, 1957.

2 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)  
3 calendar days after it becomes law.
