



Pipeline volume shows consistency for FY 24. The annual increases are due to effective business development activities, and this focus will continue. SBA 504 increases are clearly evident.


- Twenty (20) Business that have participated in Level Up programming are now in the Business Development pipeline to apply for loans.

Prince George's LEVEL UP Businesses


